Vacancies on the School Board - Filling Vacancies

Vacancy

Elective office of a School Board member becomes vacant before the term's expiration when any of the following occurs:

1. The death of the incumbent;
2. His or her resignation in writing filed with the Secretary of the School Board;
3. His or her becoming a person under legal disability;
4. His or her conviction of a felony, bribery, perjury, or other infamous crime, or of any offense involving a violation of official oath;
5. His or her removal from office;
6. The decision of competent tribunal declaring his or her election void;
7. His or her ceasing to be an inhabitant of a particular area from which he or she was elected, if the residential requirements contained in The School Code are violated; or
8. His or her conviction of having an illegal conflict of interest.
9. Acceptance of a second public office that is incompatible with Board membership.

Filling Vacancies

Whenever a vacancy occurs, the remaining members shall notify the Regional Superintendent of Schools of that vacancy within 5 days after its occurrence and shall fill the vacancy until the next regular school board election, at which election a successor shall be elected to serve the remainder of the unexpired term. However, if the vacancy occurs with less than 868 days remaining in the term, or if the vacancy occurs less than 88 days before the next regularly scheduled election for School Board Members, then the person so appointed shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term, and no election to fill the vacancy shall be held. The successor shall have the same type of residential qualifications as his or her predecessor. The Board shall fill the vacancy within 45 days after it occurred by a public vote at a meeting of the Board.

Should the Board fail to act within forty-five (45) days after the vacancy occurs, the Regional Superintendent of Schools under whose supervision and control the District is operating, shall within thirty (30) days after the remaining members have failed to act, fill the vacancy. If the Regional Superintendent fails to act, the vacancy shall be filled at the next regularly scheduled election.

Whenever a vacancy occurs on the School Board, the Board will accept applications from District residents who are interested in filling the vacancy. After reviewing the applications, the board may invite the prospective candidates for personal interviews to be conducted during duly scheduled closed meetings.
