Board/Superintendent Relationship

The Board and Superintendent constitute the management team for the District. The Board-Superintendent relationship is based on mutual respect for their complementary roles.

The Board hires, evaluates, and seeks the recommendations of the Superintendent as the District's chief executive officer. The Board adopts policies necessary to provide general direction for the District and to encourage achievement of District goals. The Superintendent develops plans, programs, and procedures needed to implement those policies and directs the District's day-to-day operations.

The Superintendent shall keep the Board informed about school operations. Board members, individually and collectively, will promptly refer to the Superintendent for study and recommendation, all criticisms, complaints, or suggestions which come to their attention.

The Superintendent is the principal contact between the Board and the staff. He or she shall act as spokesperson for the staff insofar as school operations are concerned.
