Emergency Plans

A primary concern of the Board of Education is the safety and well-being of the students and staff. In order to provide the maximum safety for all individuals in each District building, the Superintendent will ensure that provisions are made for emergencies and/or disasters.

The Building Principal shall develop a plan of fire, civil defense, and tornado warning, protection, and evacuation. This plan shall be distributed at the beginning of each school year to each teacher. There shall be an appropriate number (at least 3) of full participation exit drills during the regular school term. School fire drills shall be conducted in September and regularly throughout the year to avoid forgetfulness of procedures and routes. The goal is to secure rapid evacuation of the building in an orderly manner and without panic, injury, or loss of life, in the event of an actual fire.

The Superintendent will assign to a member of his staff the responsibility of monitoring the effectiveness of fire drill performance in each building.

Procedures will be developed and rehearsed for use in the event of a tornado warning. In general, pupils will be kept in the buildings in pre-designated safety areas.

The safety of all individuals shall be the primary consideration in dealing with bomb threats. Procedures shall be developed cooperatively with fire and law enforcement agencies.
