District instructional coaches, paraprofessionals and support staff are also at each school. 58.6% of teachers have Master's Degree or higher. 98.8% of teachers evaluated as profcient or excellent.

The District has three schools with SCHOOLS students in Kindergarten through 8th Grade: Greenbrook Elementary, Waterbury Elementary, and Spring Wood Middle School. The District also has an Early Childhood Center for students ages 3-5.

Every K-8 student has their own Chromebook and each classroom is equipped with a Promethean Board. The District recently opened a new Innovation Center with books, state-of-the-art technology & makerspace. In 2020-21, all schools will have new innovation learning centers and many future-ready classrooms.

GROWTH

Growth of Student Proficiency Levels from 2018 to 2019 was 52% in Math and 48% in English Language Arts. **Proficiency** shows whether or not students have mastered a common, high standard. Growth recognizes progress toward and beyond the standard regardless of where each student started.



HOME LANGUAGES

District families have identified at least 41 different world languages spoken at home. Interpreters are provided for parent-teacher meetings and report cards to assist with communication and family engagement. 19.9% of students in the District are English Language Learners.

\$21M DISTRICT FINANCES



The District's Financial Profile is 3.90 or Financial Recognition which is the highest award a district can receive in Illinois. The District spends an average of \$12,350 per student at each school in the district.
